On February 2024, Alaina Dulaney, the Assistant Commonwealth's Attorney, the Defendant, and and Kim Stover, Counsel for the Defendant, appeared before this Court. The Defendant is indicted for the felony of STRANGULATION and appeared while on bond.

The roll call was taken, and the Jurors took their place in the Jury Box.

The Jury heard the rest of the evidence presented by the Commonwealth. At the conclusion of the evidence presented, Counsel for the Defendant moved the Court to strike the evidence presented by the Commonwealth. The Court, after hearing argument, denied the motion for the reasons stated on the record.

The Jury was recalled and heard all of the evidence presented on behalf of the Defendant.

Counsel for the Defendant moved the Court to renew the motion to strike. The Court, after hearing argument, denied the motion for the reasons stated on the record.

The Jury received the instructions of the Court, heard closing arguments of Counsel and was sent to deliberate. After some time, the Jury returned to Court and rendered the following verdict:

"We, the Jury, on the issue joined in the case of the Commonwealth of Virginia versus Defendant, find the Defendant not guilty of STRANGULATION.

The Jury was not polled.

The Jury was discharged.

In accordance with the verdict rendered by the Jury, the Court found the Defendant, [REDACTED]
